

Your pet has recently been diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD). The International Renal Interest Society (IRIS) has a created a staging protocol for guidance in testing and treatment for your pet. Please see the following link for more information:

Based on IRIS protocols these are current recommendations for your pet:

STAGE 1

- Discontinue potentially nephrotoxic (kidney damaging) drugs if possible.
- Make sure your pet has access to fresh water. Hydration is very important.
- Schedule an appointment to measure blood pressure.
- Bring a urine sample or schedule an appointment for urine collection for urinalysis and urine protein/creatinine levels. If your pet is experiencing protein loss in the urine there are medications to help with this.
- Recheck blood pressure and kidney blood values every 3-6 months based on doctor recommendation.

STAGE 2

- All of Stage 1 recommendations plus:
- Consider transition to a prescription renal diet.

STAGE 3 AND 4

- All of Stage 1 and 2 recommendations plus:
- Consider fluid therapy. Either IV in hospital or subcutaneous (SQ) in hospital or at home. Your doctor will discuss each option.
- Consider supportive medications such as anti nausea drugs, appetite stimulants, phosphate binders, medication for anemia. Your pet's doctor will provide guidance on these options.
